Greetings Brothers!



In response to your request, here are a few of my thoughts and impressions about the initiation back in November. First, Scottish Rite and its degree philosophies/lessons answered many questions I had about certain parts of freemasonry that thru the regular degree work in Blue Lodge I had yet to uncover, but more importantly has lead me to desire an even deeper understanding of Masonry in a quest for "more light". To that end, I found the class format which we attended on the individual degrees given by John Woodward to be very well done. Given the immense amount to information and background in each degree, I very much appreciated that he conducted them in simple format of what the meaning of each degree was about and the thought process that goes along with that degree. Speaking for myself, this gave me the message of each degree, but didn't overwhelm me to the point everything became muddled together, making it substantially easier to go about increasing my knowledge of the individual degrees thru personal study since the reunion. This combined with Brent Morris' history lesson of the origins of Blue Lodge. Scottish Rite and York Rite made for a wonderful base to work off of for individual study once home.

In regards to the setting used for the initiation process, the Scottish Rite temple in Wichita, anyone who is serious about Freemasonry and its associated bodies could not be in anything other than total awe of this setting for such an endeavor. Finally, and this is just a personal observation, most individuals at the reunion/candidate initiation were wearing name badges or plates. I found this to be of great benefit as while I readily remember faces, I often have difficulty remembering names after first introductions. This combined with Jim Winn introducing me to several black caps immediately upon entering the Temple, who took me "under their wings" so to speak throughout the initiation process made a person such as myself, one who entered the Temple that Saturday morning not knowing a single individual there, instantaneously feel welcome and more at ease.

Remembrance & Renewal to Honor the Knights of Rose Croix who have fallen over the past year.

The Ceremony of Remembrance and Renewal is a public observance designed as a two-part celebration that has been preserved as a solemn service—a ceremony to honor the Knights of Rose Croix who have fallen over the past year. The first part of this commemoration is a gathering to remember our friends, honoring those that have passed by the extinguishing of the lights. section is symbolic of the crucifixion, reminding us of our mortality. It is recognition of our Brothers who passed over the last year and their lives and earthly labors. The second section is the relighting of the lights, recognition of the resurrection of Christ and signifies our acceptance of life hereafter; it is a celebration of what is yet to come. This custom is a time-honored tradition dating back to 1856. A ritual observed annually by Scottish Rite Masons around the world occurring on or near the vernal equinox. This year's Scottish Rite Ceremony is on Tuesday, March 21, 2017, at the Trinity United Methodist Church (901 E. Neal) in Salina, Kansas.

May 20th, 2017 5:00 PM



Please support the Valley of Salina by attending and participating in the sharing of our rituals to those


Master Masons continuing to seek further light by being a part of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry.



















Where are we going to be in 10 to 15 years from now?
