Herndon Clinic

Although there were fewer courses for graduate students in the Communication Sciences and Disorders Department this summer, the sounds of footsteps, both big and small, filled the hallways of the Herndon Clinic throughout the summer months. The Herndon Clinic provided intervention services for approximately 40 children in seven different groups and some in individual sessions. Young children and their parents were able to attend language and literacy groups which targeted the improvement of receptive and expressive language, reading, writing, spelling, and phonological awareness skills. Groups were comprised of children ranging from toddlers through 6th grade. When asked about her experience, graduate student clinician Chelsea Ernstmann shared, "Summer groups provided great opportunities for growth in collaboration with other clinicians and managing the needs and behaviors of more than one client at a time."

The newest addition to the clinic's summer groups included a parent centered approach. Parents with children aged two to three who presented with language delays were asked to attend sessions with their child two times per week for one hour. According to clinical supervisor Breanna Taylor, "Evidence suggests that parent training can lead to greater outcomes for early intervention, so the Herndon Clinic wanted to provide tools and resources the parents could use when they went home with their children." The program proved to be a great learning experience for not only children and their parents, but also for the student clinicians providing services. Graduate student clinician Kylie Gaughan explained, "It gave me the unique opportunity to work with both parents and their children to teach the parents how to maximize communication with their children. I feel that this program definitely benefitted the clients, as well as

their parents, because we gave them strategies to practice during the session, then apply at home."

Another group of children participated in a Preschool Summer Literacy Camp to target prereading and phonological awareness skills. Peer modeling allowed the children to learn from their typically developing peers. Graduate student clinicians also incorporated an "I do, we do, you do" approach in which they first modeled an activity for students, then together the small group completed the same activity, and finally, the children completed the activity with a partner while the clinicians observed.

Children ages 1st grade through 6th grade participated in the language and literacy summer groups. They worked on spelling, decoding, comprehension, and writing through the use of books. The children practiced telling stories or summarizing what they had read ensuring that they incorporated important story grammar elements such as character, setting, complication and feelings. They also had the opportunity to write their own stories using the same story grammar elements; this also allowed them to incorporate spelling patterns that they were learning. Many of these children struggle with reading, writing, and spelling; these are not preferred activities for most of them! The graduate student clinicians worked hard to make learning fun, meaningful, and challenging at the same time. Over the course of the summer, the children increased their spelling abilities and ability to answer comprehension questions about books that were read. Besides the specific language and literacy goals that were established, the children in the groups also showed improvement on working together as a group and supporting one another.





What is the Knights of St Andrew?

It is a Black Hat group designed to get new Scottish Rite members involved within the Valley and is based on the 29th Degree. You must be a Black Hat to join and if you ever receive KCCH or 33rd Degree you can still be a member but no longer can Vote or be an Officer.

As many of you know we have a Chapter of Knights of St Andrew in the Salina Valley. When we first started it was very active but as the original leaders have advanced to KCCH and 33 Degree. The active membership has dropped off and the Venerable Master of the Chapter passed away so it has been dormant for a few years.
