Splish, Splash, Speech! At the Herndon Clinic



Splish, splash, speech! This summer, the Herndon Clinic organized aquatic speech therapy sessions for five-year-old client, Harrison. Supervisor, Breanna Taylor, contacted the Center for Health Improvement (Hays, KS) and was excited to find that swim instructor, Kelly Flaska, was more than happy to collaborate with the Herndon Clinic to provide this unique experience.

Diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder, Harrison has struggled with over-stimulation in various situations; however, his family has reported that water often helps Harrison become calm and regulated. Although he loves water and swimming, Harrison has never attended swimming lessons due to the family's concerns that group swimming lessons may be too over-stimulating for Harrison.

As a result, a combination speech therapy session and swim lesson was planned. Goals for the session included preparing Harrison for the structure of swim lessons, ensuring Harrison's safety, and increasing his overall engagement and communication during swimming activities. Graduate clinician, Sammy Ingham, utilized a social narrative and visual schedule to teach Harrison steps to the swimming lesson (e.g. first we wait, then we shower, then we get in the pool with the teacher). In addition, visual supports were utilized to support Harrison in learning swimming skills such as blowing bubbles, floating, and kicking. Sammy reports of her experience providing aquatic therapy, "It was a great opportunity to collaborate with a team of individuals from different professions including my supervising SLP. Harrison's swim instructor, kindergarten teacher,

and family. My favorite part however, was sharing smiles and taking turns blowing water bubbles with Harrison!"

Thanks to the Scottish Rite Masons, the Herndon Clinic was able to offer affordable aquatic speech therapy services to Harrison eliminating any stress that may have come from declined or delayed insurance reimbursement. With the support of the Masons, the Herndon Clinic continues to explore new and exciting opportunities for children in the community.



Feast of Tishri, October 18, 2016 Scottish Rite Building, 1416 S. Santa Fe, Salina, Kansas

The Feast of Tishri is an essential part of the 14th Degree and eludes to the symbolic details of the Temple's position, design, construction, furnishing, and decoration as the meta-phorical temple of Freemasonry built in the hearts of every brother.
