
Message from the Personal Representative

Message from the Secretary

Greetings Brothers:

Almost every Master Mason who is afforded an opportunity to petition for the Scottish Rite Degrees naturally raises the question in his mind, "Why should I take the Scottish Rite Degrees?" It is a fair and quite appropriate question for him to ask as it is of utmost importance that the prospective initiate have a clear and definite understanding of what the Rite stands for and is endeavoring to accomplish. Here are a few reasons.

The Scottish Rite Degrees give us a sense of historical values and standards. Today is the child of yesterday, and no one can understand the significance of the events that are shaking the world unless he sees them from the vantage point of history. Out of the crises of the past, man has discovered principles that are as solid as the mountains, as enduring as the stars.

The moral truths that prevailed in Jerusalem, Athens, and Rome are just as valid, just as imperative in the digital 21st century. In his confidence in the reality of these principles, man has built his faith in the permanent value of moral truth. Here is to be found the basis of optimism, of faith in the free institutions, and of confidence in a civilization resting on ethical principles. No man can witness the Degrees of the Scottish Rite and be either a cynic or a pessimist. They renew his faith in God, in man, and in the process of history.

The Scottish Rite Degrees put into picturesque but explicit language the civic and social ideals implicit in the Blue Lodge Degrees. For centuries, Freemasonry has been a tremendous force for enlightenment, freedom, and social progress in Europe and in the Americas. It was neither a whim nor mere prejudice that caused the Nazis and Fascists to proscribe Freemasonry. Why did the Nazi oppressors hate Masonry? Why did

Herndon Clinic: Story about Scout



However, what if going out to eat was a stressful and daunting task? What if instead of scrutinizing the menu for what sounds good you're scouring the list for something easy Going out to eat is typically considered an exciting event: whether it means you're trying the new restaurant in town that everyone has been talking about or it simply means you don't have to go to the store and do dishes! to pronounce?

Scout is a young man who has already accumulated a long list of accomplishments for any adult, although he'll only be a junior this fall. He was elected class president his sophomore year, received his Eagle Scout rank in April 2017, and frequently volunteers for leadership roles within his Boy Scout Troop. Scout portrays himself as confident in who he is and what he has to offer, he's self-motivated and knows how to set goals to work towards.

This wasn't always the case for Scout. He first came to the Herndon Clinic three years ago to have his speech evaluated. When asked for examples of how his speech impacted him, he described going out to eat with his family as something he dreaded. His younger brother would often order for him or clarify when the waitress asked additional questions; Scout also stated that he often ordered his drink based off of what he thought would be easiest to say, not because it's what he wanted.

Scout was able to participate in regular speech therapy sessions to increase his speech fluency thanks to a Scottish Rite scholarship. Scout's determination and motivation assisted in his ability to succeed in services, as well as the support and dedication of his family. Scout concluded his three years of therapy sessions by giving a speech to

a room filled with graduate and undergraduate clinicians. He praised them for choosing such a rewarding profession to help those with various communication disorders.

"The Herndon Clinic has exceeded our expectations. Before starting the program in 2014, Scout could not complete a sentence without stuttering. He was extremely down on himself about the thought of never being able to speak in public or order from a menu by himself. His disfluency was a tough situation for the whole family. Three year later, he embraces the idea of speaking to others and having a captive audience. I am grateful for everything you all have done for him...truly grateful!" stated Janelle, Scout's mother.

The next time you're eating out, consider all the communication opportunities. How many times are your communication attempts successful? Be grateful for the successful moments and consider the other person's perspective when there is a breakdown.



Spreading Light on the Chivalric Orders

Some of you may have attended the Feast of Kadosh earlier this year where I presented on the Council of Kadosh. As both the Commander of Kadosh and the Venerable Master for the Knights of St. Andrew, I felt some of the information was well worthy of revisiting. The Council of Kadosh is made up of the 19° - 30° and of those the Chivalric Orders are the 28° - 30°. They are often seen as the heart of Scottish Rite Masonry. The information gleaned in this article comes from a wide variety of resources across the Worldwide Web, articles, and books.

I believe for each of us to better understand the Council of Kadosh, we have to first understand what Kadosh is. Some may ask, is it a group, a place, a person, or a process? According to the Supreme Council, 33° Scottish Rite Freemasonry, Southern Jurisdiction, USA, "Kadosh, is the Hebrew word for Holy! The distinction of Kadosh further means or describes someone or something that is inherently sacred, selected, or set apart; made holy or sacred by divine rite or ceremony." Therefore, the Council of Kadosh is the Council of the Sacred or Holy Degrees. I believe these Degrees have taught each of us some of our greatest Masonic lessons, provide a foundation for each of us and provides direction on how we should be living our lives.

Leading into the Chivalric Degrees is the 27°, though not a Chivalric Degree, it sets the stage for them to follow. The 27° is based on the Crusades and the Templar Knights, and teaches us about symbolism and the one true God.

Next, the 28°, the first of the Chivalric Degrees, is the Knight Commander of the Temple. In this Degree the lesson teaches us about a Knight's character and being virtuous, loyal, truthful, and courageous. If we examine these traits looking deeper into each of them, we first find loyalty; loyalty is an unwavering allegiance. We are all on differing journeys in life; when we choose not to waiver from the path the Lord has put us on, that is loyalty. When we uphold and defend a marriage or even a friendship, as opposed to veering off path, that is loyalty. Truth means being real and honest with the facts; for a man who has not fully resolved that he will speak only the truth, will certainly stumble, and no doubt part of his life will crumble because he had failed to hold onto and

practice the virtue of truth. Looking deeper at Courage: in 1 Cornicles 19:13 we find scripture tells us "Be of good courage, and let us behave ourselves valiantly for our people, and for the cities of our God: and let the LORD do that which is good in his sight."

In the 29°, The Order of the Knight of St. Andrew teaches us that knowledge is essential, humility, patience, and generosity are honorable and righteous, and that the knights of old held virtue, truth, and honor to be the most essential qualities of man's character. The Knights of St. Andrew, Valley of Salina are working diligently to put forth the 29th Degree at statewide conferral in 2018. This Order reminds each of us of the necessary Knightly virtues: Humility, Patience, Self-denial, Charity, Clemency, Generosity, Virtue, Truth, and Honor.

In the 30°, the Order of the Knight of Kadosh, or as some refer to it: The Knight of the Black and White Eagle. This Order teaches us that in death there is life and to always protect our soul! To believe in God and Country, and to stand for what is right and just.

Each of these concepts taught in the Chivalric Orders is important in itself; each of these virtues is an admirable quality, but when all of these are combined into the way we live our life, we discover the power of Chivalry. It should be our goal to live our lives daily keeping these virtues alive in our hearts and displayed through our character while at home, in the office, or on the street. A person who lives by a code of Chivalry in today's world allows everyone to see his qualities reflected in his armor.



I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself to you as Wise Master, Valley of Salina. Due to an unfortunate situation, the elected Wise Master is not able to fulfill his responsibilities for the entire year and I have agreed to step in as his replacement. 
